



ANICA JUŠIĆ, redovita profesorica neuropsihijatrije u mirovini, Medicinski fakultet Sveučilišta u Zagrebu.

Rođena 1926. Zagreb. Diplomirala 1952., doktorirala 1976., Medicinski fakultet Sveučilišta u Zagrebu. Osnovala i bila predstojnica Centra/Zavoda za neuromuskularne bolesti Neurološke klinike, KBC Zagreb do umirovljenja 1991. Pokrenula hospicijski pokret / novu medicinsku struku RH.

Područje znanstvenog interesa: elektromioneurografija, Mijastenija gravis, Amiotrofična lateralna sklerozna. Opetovano stipendistkinja A.von Humboldt zaklade.

Voditeljica 6 znanstvenih projekata (2 SAD) iz neurologije, te niza stručno/organizacijskih pojekata (RH, SAD, Nizozemska) iz palijativne medicine. Mentorica doktorandima i magistrandima 33 puta. Publicirala 8 knjiga, 96 neuroloških članaka u časopisima (u stranim 40), 94 u knjigama i zbornicima; 116 članaka iz palijativne medicine.

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ANICA JUŠIĆ, Prof., Ph.D., full Professor of Neuropsychiatry, School of Medicine University of Zagreb. Born 1926 in Zagreb. Graduated at School of Medicine University Zagreb, MD (1952), Ph.D. (1976).

Founded and chaired Centre/Institute for Neuromuscular Diseases, Neurological Department, KBC Rebro, until retirement 1991. Started hospice movement/new medical branch in RC.

Dominant scientific interests: Electromyoneurography, Myasthenia Gravis, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis. Repeated fellowships by A.von Humboldt Foundation.

Leader 6 scientific projects (2 USA) in Neurology, many professional/organisational projects (RC, USA, Holland) in Palliative Medicine. Mentorship in doctor and magister thesis 33 times. Published 8 books, 96 neurological articles in journals (40 in international), 94 in books; 116 in Palliative Medicine journals or books.

Rewards: 1975 Work orden with golden star, 1988 membership in Research Group for Neuromuscular Diseases of WFN, 1944 honorary member of CAMS, 2002 laureat, 2008 reward by MES, Zagreb.
