



SUZANA TKALČIĆ, izvanredni profesor, specijalist veterinarske patologije, Veterinarski fakultet Sveučilišta zdravstvenih znanosti u Pomoni, CA, SAD (College of Veterinary Medicine, Western University of Health Sciences, Pomona, California, USA).

Rođena 1969. godine u Samoboru, diplomirala 1995. na Veterinarskom fakultetu Sveučilišta u Zagrebu, te doktorirala 2001. na Sveučilištu u Georgiji (SAD); naslov disertacije "Enterohemoragična E. coli u teladi: karakterizacija i učinak prehrane (Enterohemorrhagic E. coli in Calves: Characterization and effect of diet)". Specijalizirala je veterinarsku patologiju na istome fakultetu i Državnom dijagnostičkom laboratoriju u Ahens, GA, radila godinu dana kao klinički instruktor na Zavodu za veterinarsku patologiju. Od 2003. predaje na Western University of Health Sciences.

Područje znanstvenog interesa: patologija morskih sisavaca i divljih Životinja, komparativna patologija, zdravlje mora, te jedno zdravlje. Suradnik je na 12 znanstvenih projekata, mentor 20-tak studenata, te autorica 57 kongresnih priopćenja i 30-tak znanstvenih i stručnih radova. Stalni je stručni suradnik i medicinski savjetnik Zoološkog vrta Los Angeles, Medicinskog fakulteta u Zagrebu, Sveučilišta u Zadru, te od 2014. i Škole za javno zdravstvo, San Diego State University. Dobitnica je Jurakove nagrade za komparativnu patologiju 2011.

SUZANA TKALČIĆ, associate professor of veterinary pathology, College of Veterinary Medicine, Western University of Health Sciences, Pomona, California, USA. Born 1969 in Samobor, Croatia, graduated 1995. from the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Zagreb, and earned her PhD in 2001. from the University of Georgia, Athens, GA, USA. Dissertation title: "Enterohemorrhagic E. coli in Calves: Characterization and Effect of Diet". She completed her residency in veterinary pathology at the College of Veterinary Medicine and State diagnostic laboratory in Ahens, GA, and she continued to work as a clinical instructor at the Department of Veterinary Pathology, CVM, UGA. Since 2003, she is on the faculty at the WUHS in California, USA. Her research interests include pathology of marine mammals, comparative pathology, ocean health and one health. She is involved in 12 research projects, mentoring 20 veterinary and graduate students, author of 30 publications and 57 scientific abstracts at international meetings. She is a medical advisor to the LA Zoo, and adjunct faculty for the School of Public Health SDSU, Medical Faculty University of Zagreb, and the University of Zadar. She is the recipient of the Jurak award for comparative pathology in 2011, and CAMS adjunct member since 2015.
